



DONUT HOSE PACK

This pack is designed to carry all types of single jacket wild land hose. We named it the Donut Hose pack but it will securely hold hose in any configuration. The hose bundle in the pictures is a donut bundle but the same steps are used for securing Cleveland-Gassner style hose bundles.



This pack is designed to hold 300' of 1" cotton jacket; 200' of 1-1/2" cotton jacket; or 300' 1-1/2" synthetic jacket hose.



1
Loosen the blue and yellow webbing straps that connect to the side wing panels.

Release the metal cam-lock buckle and pull the blue webbing clear of the buckle and the metal loop. Repeat these steps for the yellow webbing which will hold the second bundle of hose.

**3A**

Insert the first roll of hose into bottom/yellow area of the pack.

**3B**

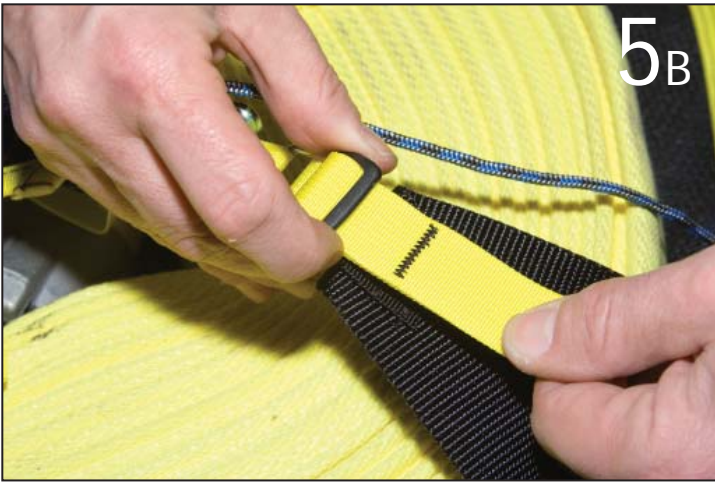
Thread yellow web back through metal loop and into metal cam-lock buckle. Make sure that the end of the web only comes through the cam-lock a little past the diagonal cut on the webbing (about 1" - 2" from the end of the web), otherwise it will not release easily when you pull the rip cord.

**4**

Any slack in the web can be taken up by pulling the excess through the black plastic ladder-lock buckle which is behind the metal cam-lock buckle.

**5A**

Larger or smaller hose bundles can also be accommodated by adjusting the length of the 1 1/2" black web at the bottom of the bag.

Additional adjustment is possible by lengthening or shortening the 1" web between the 1 ½" black web and the metal loop.

After finding the right adjustment for how the hose bundle rides in the pack, tighten the webbing to the two wing panels.

Once the hose bundle is secure pull on the rip cord to see if there is any slack. If there is any slack tie a new knot in the cord next to the metal buckle. *We strongly suggest that you DO NOT cut off any excess cord as you may need it when carrying another style of hose bundle.*

Repeat the above steps for the second hose bundle using the blue web.

**9**

To release hose bundle, unsnap the color coded rip-cord webbing, and pull down with smooth continuous force.

**10**

The hose bundle will drop free of the pack. If it does not drop free check to ensure that there isn't too much web tail coming through the metal cam-lock buckle (see step 3B). If the hose bundle didn't drop and it looks like the web tail was adjusted properly, then check the adjustment of the other straps to make sure there isn't too much slack there (see steps 4-5B).
